

6 Injured in University Shooting in Baghdad

BAGHDAD (Xinhua) – Six people, including students, were injured on Sunday in a shooting incident inside a private university in Iraq's capital Baghdad, a source from the Iraqi Interior Ministry said.

The incident occurred around noon when a student of al-Esraa University in Karada neighborhood entered the campus and opened fire with a pistol, wounding four students, a university teacher, and a guard, the source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

The attacker tried to flee the scene but the security forces arrested him and seized his pistol, the source said. Iraqi security forces have launched an investigation into the incident, the source added.

Hezbollah to Bury Iconic Leader Nasrallah After 60-Day Ceasefire: Official

BEIRUT (Dispatches) – The head of Hezbollah's Communication and Coordination Committee announced the approximate time and place of burial of Seyyed Hassan Nasrallah, the martyred secretary general of the Hamas movement.

The burial ceremony of Seyyed Hassan Nasrallah will be held at the end of the 60-day ceasefire between the Zionist regime and the Hezbollah resistance movement, senior Hezbollah official Wafiq Safa said Sunday during a tour of the site where Nasrallah was martyred by the Zionist regime.

Speaking in Beirut's Dahiyeh suburb, Safa confirmed that preparations are also underway for the burial of Nas-

rallah's successor, Hashem Safieddine, who was also assassinated a few days later.

"Hezbollah is ready to face any aggression in the way it deems appropriate," Safa added.

Lebanese resistance group Hezbollah took effect late in November.

Safa also said Hezbollah is now stronger than ever before, a fact that the Zionist enemy has witnessed firsthand.

The truce deal came into effect on November 27. It will last for 60 days in the hope of reaching a permanent cessation of hostilities.

Under the agreement, an international monitoring committee, headed by the U.S., is tasked with overseeing the implementation of the ceasefire.

Hezbollah has reiterated that it is in full possession of its capabilities, warning that it will respond decisively to Israeli forces occupying Lebanon once the ceasefire concludes.

The Zionist regime assassinated Nasrallah on September 27 last year and Safieddine shortly afterward.

Protest Held in Tel Aviv to Condemn Zionist Genocidal War in Gaza

TEL AVIV (Dispatches) – Scores of people in the Israeli-occupied territories demonstrated outside the war ministry headquarters in Tel Aviv on Sunday to condemn the Zionist regime's ongoing war on the Gaza Strip.

"Killers of children," chanted protesters as soldiers entered the Kirya base, which houses the war ministry headquarters, Israel's Army Radio reported.

The protest came amid growing anger over the regime's genocidal war on the Gaza Strip since Oct. 7, 2023, despite a UN Security Council resolution demanding an immediate ceasefire.

A day earlier, the families of Israeli captives in Gaza called on the Zionist regime to immediately finalize a deal after Hamas' military wing,

the Al-Qassam Brigades, released a video showing one of the captives alive.

On Saturday, the Al-Qassam Brigades broadcast a video of captive Liri Albaj, who expressed frustration over being ignored by the Zionist regime and military, along with other captives in Gaza. She asked to the occupying regime poignantly, "Do you want to kill us?"

During a press conference held outside the war ministry in Tel Aviv following the release of the video, the families issued a statement: "We have received proof of life for a captive enduring hell, which should be a driving force to finalize an immediate exchange deal."

They warned saying "any partial deal would amount to a death sentence for many

captives."

The families sharply criticized Zionist prime minister Benjamin Netanyahu for obstructing a prisoner exchange agreement with Palestinian factions.

On Friday, Hamas announced the resumption of indirect negotiations with the occupying regime in Qatar's capital, Doha, focusing on a ceasefire, the withdrawal of Zionist troops from Gaza, and the return of displaced persons.

Mediation efforts led by the U.S., Egypt, and Qatar to reach a ceasefire in Gaza have so far failed due to Zionist premier Benjamin Netanyahu's refusal to halt the war.

The occupying regime holds over 10,300 Palestinian prisoners, while Hamas

is said to be holding around 100 Israeli captives in Gaza. The group also said that dozens of captives had died in indiscriminate Israeli airstrikes.

The Zionist regime's army has continued a genocidal war on Gaza that has killed over 45,650 victims, mostly women and children, since Oct. 7, 2023 despite a UN Security Council resolution calling for an immediate ceasefire.

In November 2024, the International Criminal Court issued arrest warrants for Netanyahu and his former war minister Yoav Gallant for war crimes and crimes against humanity in Gaza.

The occupying regime also faces a genocide case at the International Court of Justice for its war on the enclave.

Gaza's Health Ministry Reports Severe Shortage of Medicine

GAZA (Dispatches) – Gaza's Health Ministry warned Sunday of a severe shortage of medicine and medical supplies amid the Zionist regime's genocidal war on the Palestinian enclave, Anadolu Agency reports.

"Stocks of 120 medicines, including 20 cancer treatments, are completely depleted in the ministry's warehouses," health official Wael al-Sheikh told the official Palestine TV.

He said the ministry's debt is nearing three billion shekels (approximately \$800 million).

The ongoing war on Gaza by the Zionist regime, now in its 15th month, has exacerbated the Palestinian Authority (PA)'s financial crisis, primarily due to increased Israeli deductions from Palestinian tax revenues.

Since October 7, 2023, the Zionist regime has been withholding approximately 45% of the monthly tax revenues, known in Palestine and to the Zionist regime as maqasa, which

are collected by the occupying regime on behalf of the PA on Palestinian imports and exports and Israel in return earns a commission of 3%.

The revenues are estimated to total around \$220 million every month and represent the main source of income for the PA.

Taliban Test New Guided Rocket System

KABUL (Anadolu) – Afghan Taliban's interim administration has claimed that it has successfully tested a new guided rocket system in the capital Kabul.

Interim Defense Ministry spokesperson Enayatullah Khwarazmi said on X that the Milan Konkursi (9M135) guided missile system was tested at the administration's artillery headquarters.

The guided rocket system is designed to target armored tanks, warships, and low-flying helicopters, according to Khwarazmi.

He added that a group of 13 soldiers have completed training to operate the system.

"This guided rocket was activated for the first time in the country," Khwarazmi said, but gave no further details on how the Taliban developed the system.

The Taliban returned to power in August 2021 after the withdrawal of U.S.-led forces, ending a two-decade war in Afghanistan.

Earlier, the Taliban claimed that its interim administration had repaired 70 military planes and helicopters damaged by U.S. forces before their departure from Afghanistan.

According to CNN, the U.S. left behind around \$7 billion worth of military equipment and weapons in Afghanistan, handed over to the former Afghan government over 16 years. The Taliban took control of this stockpile after seizing Kabul.

However, reports indicated that U.S. troops damaged various military aircraft, helicopters, and other vehicles before leaving the country on Aug. 31, 2021.

Report: Israeli Soldier Flees Brazil Amid Investigation Into Gaza War Crimes

AL-QUDS (Dispatches) – An Israeli soldier accused of committing war crimes during the Gaza aggression has fled Brazil where authorities are pressing for an investigation, local media said on Sunday.

The investigation stems from a complaint filed by the Hind Rajab Foundation (HRF), a Belgium-based organization advocating for justice for Palestinian victims, the Israeli public broadcaster KAN said.

According to Israeli Channel 12, the complaint includes over 500 pages of evidence, including videos, geolocation data, and open-source intelligence, linking the soldier to destruction in Gaza.

HRF called for the soldier's immediate detention to prevent his escape or the destruction of evidence, the channel said.

Despite a court order, the soldier, identified as a reservist, managed to leave Brazil and is reportedly en route back to the occupied territories, KAN said. Details about how he evaded arrest remain unclear.

The escape follows a series of similar incidents involving Zionist troops abroad. Last month, a Palestinian advocacy group in Sri Lanka called for the arrest of an active-duty Israeli soldier spotted in the country, prompting his immediate evacuation by Zionist regime authorities, according to Is-

rael's Channel 12.
